Christmas Series - God in the Manger "The Personal Transcendent"

Week 1: God's <u>gift</u> to humanity is his <u>limiting</u> with the <u>purpose</u> of <u>salvation</u>, that we might experience <u>infinite</u> <u>forgiveness</u> which leads to <u>eternal life</u>.

Week 2 - The Personal Being of God

God interacts with his creation as an <u>individual</u>, with <u>self</u>-consciousness and <u>will</u>, capable of <u>feeling</u>, <u>choosing</u>, and <u>reciprocating</u> relationships.

Two Ways God is Personal in the Christmas Story

#1 - God is **personal** in that he showed **purposes** in taking on human flesh.

#2 - God is **personal** in that he showed he **cared** for people.

Scripture Reference: Matthew 1:20-21

If God <u>isn't</u> personal, then he isn't <u>compassionate</u> toward our <u>sin</u> situation, either dealing <u>harshly</u> with us, or acting <u>indifferent</u>.

A <u>personal</u> <u>relationship</u> with God is what he <u>seeks</u> from us, and is the <u>basis</u> for our <u>salvation</u>.

Scripture Reference: Matthew 7:21
